



Stanford University researchers are currently recruiting children with autism spectrum disorder to participate in a research study which examines the effects of N-acetylcysteine (NAC) on restricted and repetitive behaviors (RRBs).

## Who is eligible?

Children who:

- are diagnosed with Autism
- are aged between 3 and 12
- exhibit restricted and repetitive behaviors
- are willing to drink NAC dissolved in water



## What is involved?

- Cognitive and behavioral assessments (such as IQ testing)
- Either sleep (young children) or learn to lie still for a magnetic resonance imaging (MRI) scan
- Wear an electroencephalography (EEG) cap
- 12 week NAC or placebo administration period
