Changing the future for kids with autism

Who we are:

The Early Social Development Lab at USC, directed by Dr. Jessica Bradshaw, is a clinical research lab focused on **infant attention, motor, and social skills**.

What we do:

We study **early identification of autism spectrum disorder (ASD) in the first year of life**, which paves the way for earlier interventions and improved outcomes for individuals and families affected by ASD.

Who we see:

We follow babies* who have an older sibling with autism through the first 3 years, providing feedback and tips on supporting your child's development.

All participants receive early assessments including a free autism evaluation by our licensed clinical psychologist. Visits occur in home, and families may receive up to \$250 for full participation.

We see infants* who meet 1 of the following criteria:

- 1) Born preterm (between 24-32 weeks gestation)
- 2) Have an older full biological sibling diagnosed with autism
- 3) Have an older sibling who is typically developing with no family history of autism

*Infants must be under 3 months at the time of study enrollment
